

The Foundation of Prayer:

Jesus provided the perfect example of prayer. There were countless times that He went to a secluded place and sought His Father. The disciples, realizing their human inadequacy to pray, asked Christ to teach them how to pray (Luke 11:1ff). The overriding principle shown by Christ in His model prayer is this: prayer is the right to access the power and sufficiency of God (v. 13b).


